Pentecost - focus on this being the start of people following Jesus - mission. 10 days before Pentecost - 'Thy Kingdom come. The Eucharist is a reminder of Jesus' life and sacrifice and God's love and forgiveness. Giving thanks to God is a Christian duty.

Eucharist/ Holy Communion - linked to Last Supper (Easter) Christians believe in the resurrection and the afterlife.

Easter - review of story. Focus on resurrection and how the first followers of Jesus reacted. How Easter is celebrated in church - children plan own service. Real Easter Egg company.
